Online Resources	<h3>Online Resources</h3> <ul style="list-style-type: none">> Library Catalogue search - The Library catalogue lists books and journals that are available in the University of Tasmania Library .> E-journals - An electronic journal is much the same as a printed journal, but published electronically rather than on paper. You can use the E-journals link on the Library website to search the e-journals by title, browse the alphabetical list of titles, or browse by subject category. Use the library guides to find relevant journals for your subject.> Databases - The databases are electronic indexes that are used to find journal articles on a particular topic. Some databases only give references to articles, others provide the full text of many articles. This link provides an A-Z listing of all UTAS databases. Use the library guide to find relevant databases for your subject. Many databases offer the option of various languages - contact your Research & Learning Services Librarian for further information
